We look forward to welcoming them to future events at the Institute.

Central to the performance of traditional music at DkIT is the *Ceol Oirghialla* Traditional Ensemble who enrich the cultural life of the community and the North-East, performing at a number of events throughout the year. Ireland has a strong dance music tradition, which has evolved over the past two centuries. The dancing, too, has changed. Dancing has become synonymous with feiseanna, competitions that take place all over the world. The Ulster Championships taking place in Dundalk in 2014 are a significant event for the many young dancers and their teachers in the area and we are delighted to feature dancers from Scoil Rince Móna Ní Rodaigh in this concert.

This is also the 'Decade of Centenaries' and we look back to 1914. This was the year the great collector Patrick Weston Joyce died and when the Home Rule Bill was signed. Sliabh Luachra fiddle player Julia Clifford, a student of Pádraig O'Keeffe, and Limerick flute player Paddy Taylor were born. 1914 was also the year that the great Sligo fiddle player went to America and one of his fiddles is housed here at DkIT and features in tonight's concert. Coleman recorded 'Mrs Kenny's' and 'The Man of the West' in 1934.

We maintain our focus on Louth and surrounding counties also. The song 'Bríd Óg Ní Mháile' makes reference to the fairest maiden of the Oriel region. Dancers must have music and Seán Nugent, from County Tyrone, spent most of his life in Lack, Co. Fermanagh. Influential as a teacher and a composer, he was the leader of the Pride of Eirn Céilí Band and the concert features two reels from *The High Hills of Largy* including one written for his mother. 'Roslyn Castle' is found in Pádraigín Ní hUallacháin's collection *The Hidden Ulster* and is a tune from a manuscript of Patrick McGahon / Pádraig Mac Gatháin of Dungooley, Co. Louth. The manuscript is dated 30 March 1817.

Scoil Rince Móna Ní Rodaigh

Móna Lennon (Ní Rodaigh) began dancing at age six with her dance teacher Pat Matthews and went on to become one of the most successful dancers in the world, winning every award in solo dancing. Mona brought three All-Ireland titles to Dundalk in the late 1960s represented Ireland abroad at a number of celtic festivals in Brittany and Spain, and also toured the USA, Canada, England, Scotland and Libya with Comhaltas Ceoltóiri Eireann.

Mona founded Scoil Rince Móna Ní Rodaigh in 1970 having obtained her teacher's certificate. Over the past 40 odd years, she has taught and nurtured dancers who have been successful at all levels of local, provincial, national and international competition. The school has been particularly successful in céilí (team) dancing, and some of the school's most memorable achievements at this level have included winning the Senior Ladies and Mixed Céilí competitions at the world championships four years in a row.

Shortly after establishing Scoil Rince Móna Ní Rodaigh, Mona was joined by her brother Tony (himself a World Champion) and his wife Una. Throughout the mid-nineties, Móna's daughters Ciara and Dearbhla both taught with Móna, prior to heading off on their own dancing adventures worldwide.

In the late nineties, Móna was joined by Maria McCaul-Mohan, herself a former pupil of Móna's. In 2001, Mona's daughter Dearbhla re-joined the teaching staff, having returned from her travels with 'Lord of the Dance'. Dearbhla had performed as principal dancer with the company since 1996, following a very fruitful competitive career. In 2005 Ciara Lennon returned from her travels with 'Lord of the Dance' having been a principal dancer and Dance Captain with the company.

Scoil Rince Móna Ní Rodaigh now teach Irish Dancing classes in three different locations within the North East region.
